what is the certificate?



IDCL's **Oral History for Social Change** certificate teaches learners how to use oral history as a tool to advance social justice. The certificate program is an **asynchronous 15-hour experience** on ReligionAndPublicLife.org that consists of **five on-demand courses** that walk you through the process of designing your own oral history project. what is the cohort?

In addition to gaining access to the certificate's five on-demand courses, cohort members will have the opportunity to engage other learners in direct conversation, get one-on-one feedback from IDCL's team about project planning, and showcase their project with the cohort community.

The cohort will complete on-demand courses on their own timetable over a six-week period in June and July. Instructors will organize the initial and final meetings based on cohort member availability.

- **First Cohort Meeting** (Week of June 14): You will meet the cohort community, introduce your oral history goals, and set expectations for the certificate period.
- **Second Cohort Meeting** (Mid Cohort Period): You will take part in a guided discussion and Q&A with course instructors and other cohort members.
- **Final Cohort Meeting** (Week of July 26): Cohort members will showcase the oral history projects they developed over the course of the certificate, discuss and troubleshoot any challenges they during the development process, and discuss next steps in their oral history projects.
- **One-on-One Meetings:** Cohort members will meet with course designers, Eleonora Anedda and Dr. Elizabeth Melton, to discuss their specific projects and receive individualized feedback.
